I have always been in a position of service to this mission. It has been my life's work.

I am the Founder of Akal Security, I was close with Siri Singh Sahib and learned from him personally and directly. I have been spreading the teachings both of Kundalini Yoga and the teachings of the Sikhs for 52 years.

He was real and lived his own teachings.
